#### **PRINT RESOURCES**

While it is beyond the scope of this particular presentation for in-depth discussion, it is important when considering repertoire selections to do so using an Equity, Diversity, Inclusion, Accessibility (EDIA) lens. There are a number of resources available, including articles, databases, websites, and social media groups and organizations, that provide <u>"living" lists of repertoire to be reconsidered or removed</u>, and spaces to listen to and consult with professional colleagues who may be well-versed in these areas and/or are also exploring and learning to create brave classroom, rehearsal and community spaces. I believe it is our duty to examine all potential resources with a critical eye, not only for their potential pedagogical value, but also toward greater inclusivity, representation, and accessibility. For example, some songbooks may have non-programmable literature sitting alongside many tunes that meet EDIA criteria. I suggest moving forward with due diligence as you explore the range of available options, whether print or electronic.
